Draft minutes of meeting held on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2008, at sports pavilion, Iver Heath Recreation Ground.

**19. Apologies for Absence:** Mrs P Roberts/ IPC, Mrs J. Cherry/Tennis

**20. Minutes of previous meeting (10.12.07.)** were approved and signed after addition to (18) that 999 should be called to report missile throwing.

**21. Premises inspection:** Maintenance office and lock-up had satisfactory check prior to meeting Chris Sprules and Nick Fisher present temporarily. They suggested providing handle for entrance door to tennis corridor.

Football Area: damaged door to home changing room to be replaced

The chairman announced that Raymond Peters had been newly appointed to maintenance and would start work on 25 March

**22. Clerk's Report:** a) removal of mound of stone from field – outstanding

b) Mr Wilson reported that Bisons have made bollards for protection of courts/car park boundary and hope to deliver before the company's relocation to Berkshire.

c) Mr. Gould spoke to the Sunday football manager on sat 8 March about rubbish left on the field and tidy storage of goal posts/nets. (Not known if all was clear the next day)

d) Tree cutting at entrance – outstanding

e) Training on manual lowering of entrance bollard may take place on 10 April (for two key holder Councillors and for two representatives each of tennis and bowls club)

**23. Matters Raised by Chairman:** the committee was asked to note that the Bowls Club and two new officials. Ms. B. Homsleigh (sec.) and Mr. A. Whitrod (Chair.)

**24. Matters raised by Clubs:**

a) Football: Rolling of pitches now good. The club had won through to play Winchmore Hill in the final of the Maidenhead Norfolkian Senior Cup on 4 April.

b) Tennis: Agreement currently being drawn up between club sub committee and club coach for tennis coaching, with LTA advice.

Maintenance Day due on 29 March when club members will work on outdoor and indoor jobs of tidying and cleaning.

Regretfully wished to report several matters of current concern.

Recent graffiti on practice wall of new mini-court has been removed, but repainting not straightforward since multi-coloured target markings was professional.

The roof and doors of clubs own purchased metal storage shed have been vandalised.

On main room 'drop in' nights the kitchen appears to be used for more than 'emergencies' – wet floor, cooking and crocks left out unwashed.  
Damp (black) wall pitch increasing in (tennis) ladies' changing room – no obvious cause found on inspection, so cleaning/treating was suggested.  
Three playing members seem to have been lost since the end of 2007 – discomfited by anti-social behaviour outside the courts.
